BIOGRAPHICAL DETAILS

"Nicholas Rena is the most ambitious sculptor using ceramics at present in the UK. He's developed a language of symbolic vessels which he brings together in small installations of great power" EDMUND DE WAAL OBE

Born in 1963, Nicholas Rena was educated at Eton College where he studied art under the ceramicist, Gordon Baldwin. Following a degree in architecture at Cambridge University he completed an MA at The Royal College of Art in London.

His work consists of thick earthenware oversize vessel forms with precise, smooth, highly polished finishes. The body is

often deeply stained with colour, sometimes creating violently contrasting interiors and exteriors to the vessels and each piece is finished by sanding and polishing, often to resemble stone. The size and understated simplicity create a monumental effect.

Rena was nominated for the Jerwood Applied Art Prize in Ceramics in 2001. He has had over twenty exhibitions internationally as well as at the Holburne Museum, Bath, the Soane Museum and the National Museum of Scotland and his work can be seen in many permanent public collections including the Musée des Arts Decoratifs, Paris; the Musée de Louvre, Paris; the V&A Museum, London and the Carnegie institute, Pittsburgh. When I was training as an architect, and then later with ceramics, I produced work that was abstract; I used to find these buildings and the forms I designed interesting and even exciting. However it was only when I at last found the seclusion of my first studio that I calmed down, so to speak, and found something instead that wasn't simply interesting: in that studio I re-discovered an older love, one that rooted me back in time – the language of the vessel. Simple propositions such as scale and interiority and even generosity, these suddenly acquired a meaning that was richer for me than the purely abstract. I felt for the first time the thrill of a career opening up ahead of me.

If people look at my work and on occasion ask that funny question 'but what does it mean?' then I might talk of conviviality, and how ceramics evokes the pleasures of company; but that is only one part of it. These jugs and bowls are also a way of thinking about being alive in the first place, the strange wonderment in which our senses and our intelligence come together in a continuous stream – vibrantly or softly –

but always in a unified manner. Experience now has become altogether too fragmented but our sense of being alive is by contrast quite pure and simple, in the way it all coheres. Force of colour and of silhouette, both kept as palpable and true as in my own experience, this is the foundation of the pieces here at Forge and Lynch.

In her poem 'Lost Birds' Emily Dickinson famously writes that 'hope is the thing with feathers.' Perhaps for artists 'colour is the thing with feathers'. That is what I realised in my early years. I was seduced by artists as different as Anthony Caro, Mark Rothko and Bridget Riley, at a time when culture itself seemed to revel in colour. When a piece of mine comes out of the kiln it is white; at that stage the work looking like an overcast sky; only when I start layering the piece with colour does my heart quicken a little, and I think yes, there's hope here. Colour is the thing with feathers.
